CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

L: Brothers and sisters in Christ: This morning we walk with the women to the garden graveyard, to the place that has transformed our world and our own life. This is where we meet the risen Lord Jesus, who was victorious over sin, death, and the devil. We come to Him now, confessing our sins and seeking His gracious forgiveness. With sincere hearts and minds, let us confess our sins:

C: **Forgive us Lord and have mercy upon us. Forgive our self-centered rebellion against You and our lack of love for others. Roll away the stone of sin and the hardness of our own hearts and lives.**

L: Jesus has carried our sins to His own death. In your baptism your sinful nature

was united to the death of Jesus and you were raised to new life. You are a new creation in Christ Jesus! Alleluia! In Jesus' name, and by the power of His resurrection, your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen! We have been forgiven! We have been restored to new life in Christ! Alleluia!

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, “Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise.” And they remembered his words, and returning from the

COMMUNION LITURGY

L: The celebration of the Lord's Supper is a gift from Christ to His church in order to strengthen our faith and grant us His grace.
